!! DISPLAY YOUR PARKING PASS !!

PASSENGER DROP OFF: use the 15 minute parking (**Lot 10**) opposite the front door of Barrington Student Union

HANDICAPPED PARKING: is available in Lots 6, 9, 10, 22, 25, and 31 (handicapped permit required)

SHUTTLE VANS: (are available) from Lot 22 (behind Van Housen Ext. or Lot 20 (diagonal from Van Housen Ext.)

WALKING DIRECTIONS:

From Lots 20, 22, 31: walk along Watertown Dr. past Van Housen Ext. and Van Housen Hall; turn right at the walkway that leads to the side door of Union. Take the stairs or nearby elevator to the second floor. Walk all the way around to the back corner on the far side.

From Lots 25 & 25A (closest lots to the dining room): From the corner of Lot 25 walk up a steep (but relatively short) hill to the side door on the right. Once inside the Union, take the nearby stairs up to the dining room. (The elevator is on the opposite side of the building.)

From **Lot 6** (behind Kellas Hall) and **Lot 9** (along the far side of the Performing Arts Center): walk down Barrington Drive to the Union. Enter the main door, take the left stairs up, head to the back area or use elevator (see below).

ELEVATOR, STAIRS, RESTROOMS

From the front entrance to Barrington Student Union: 1) take the grand staircase up to the left side of the building; turn right and walk to the dining room at the back. *or* 2) turn into the right corridor, walk back to and through the alcove leading to the restrooms. The elevator is just beyond the "Men's Room." Once upstairs, walk all the way around to the dining room at the far back corner. Handicapped restrooms are nearby the main entrance. Restrooms are on the left before your enter the venue.
